OTNYR Council Decision amending and extending Council Decision OTNYR – COMMISSION IMPLEMENTING REGULATION (EU) .../... of XXX on certain commercial policy measures concerning certain products originating in the United States of America pursuant to Article 4(l) of Regulation (EU) No 654/2014

Thank you for your letter dated 25 May regarding the Explanatory Memorandum (EM) in relation to the above-captioned Commission Implementing Regulation (EU). As set out in the draft Withdrawal Agreement, the UK would apply the Common Customs Tariff during the transition period. Countermeasures are increased tariffs, therefore, the UK would continue to apply such measures maintained by the EU during this period.

After the end of the transition period, whether the UK would continue to implement these tariffs or implement the second set of countermeasures would depend on the customs arrangements to be agreed with the EU. The Trade Remedies Authority, which will be an independent, arms-length body, will not be responsible for deciding whether to impose these countermeasures.

I hope this answers your questions, but please do not hesitate to write back if you require any further clarification.
